1. INTRODUCTION

In a bid to promote the objectives of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan launched on October 2, 2014, the central government has launched the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship -2018 aiming at enrolling students for promoting Swachhata (cleanliness) in villages. Under this, the students are invited to select a village of their choice, and work with the village community for building a lasting system for improving the overall sanitation and hygiene in the village. It is expected that each student would devote at least 100 hours to Swachhata, and carry out specific measures for improving the sanitation and hygiene in the village.

This internship is being jointly launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development in association with the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation and is named 'Swachh Bharat Summer Internship - 100 Hours of Swachhata'. The objective is to engage youth across the country, develop their skill and orientation for sanitation related work and make Swachh Bharat Mission a 'Jan Andolan'. The student enrolled for the internship is expected to adopt one or more villages and conduct activities of their choice to contribute to the cause of rural sanitation in India. The duration would be at least 100 hours in the period 1st May to 31st July during the summer vacation.

Mr. ANAS K.T, one of the interns of *Mar Thoma College, Chungathara, Malappuram, in Kerala Sate* enrolled as 'individual' to participate in Swachh Bharat Experiential Summer Internship on 12 June 2018. With the Approval of college Nodal Officer Ms. Dhanya C, the intern selected Vazhikkadavu village of Malappuram District for doing internship activities.

1.1 VAZHICKADAVU VILLAGE AT A GLANCE : A PROFILE

Vazhikkadavu is a small village in Nilambur taluk of Malappuram District in Kerala, India. It is situated 55km away from Malappuram District headquarter. The village Positioned in rural region of Malappuram district of Kerala, it is one among the 11 villages of Nilambur Block of Malappuram district. As per the administration records, the village number of Vazhikkadavu is 627475. The total geographical area of village is 12837 hectares.

According to 2011 census, Vazhikkadavu has 47322 people. There are about 9972 houses in this Village. Female population is 52.5%. Village literacy is about 78.6% and the female literacy rate is 40.5%. The Kerala – Tamilnadu border is at 10km from Vazhikkadavu. This village connects to other parts of India like Mysore, Ooty, and Bangalore through Nilambur town. Many educational institutions are functioning in this village and among which two are CBSE affiliated Schools. The village people lived in Vazhikkadavu are come under middle class families. Agriculture and Small Entrepreneurships are the main occupation of village people.

1.2 OBJECTIVES

The Internship focused on the following specific objectives:

- ✚ To convey the Message of Swachh Bharat Mission among Students of various institutions and the local people of Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath
- ✚ To aware the students as well as the community people about the importance of Swachh Bharat All India Campaign in Modern India
- ✚ To check whether the local people of Vazhikkadavu village resort to OPEN DEFECATION or not
- ✚ To find out the various methods used by the households for the disposal of Bio degradable and Bio Non – Degradable household waste

1.3 SCOPE AND IMPORTANCE

Vazhikkadavu village is a small remote rural area in Malappuram district of Kerala. It is better to implement and extend the ‘All India Swachhata Campaign’ from the grass root level of rural areas to the upper levels. Lack of proper knowledge is the major problem of Village people to aware about the importance of Swachhata in the Today’s India. If proper hygiene and sanitation will not become a practice in our country then no will be able to save our country from the health hazards and losses that will loom over the Indian Populace in near future.

1.4 METHODOLOGY

Followings are the various methods the intern used for the Successful completion of the Internship;

- Ambiguous responses from some households
- Village people shown shyness on Open Defecation and related matters and hence the intern faced difficulty to talk about the Problems Open Defecation

2. DESCRIPTION OF VARIOUS SWACHHATA ACTIVITIES

As part of the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018, the Swachhata activities that the intern conducted in the Vazhikkadavu village include various awareness campaigns, Door – to – Door visits, Organization of Movie/Video Screenings, Waste Collection from households, Development of Compost pits and transportation of Household waste to appropriate disposal sites. Along with these Swachhata activities enlisted in the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship course, he included one more activity that is ‘**Swachhata Pledging**’. With the immense guidance from his college nodal officer and, support and help from the Vazhikkadavu local body authority, head of the various educational institutions situated in the village, the members of Various ‘*Kudumbasree*’ unit, MGNREGP workers, and the village community people, the intern completed his internship successfully in time.

2.1 AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

As part of Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018, the intern conducted various **Awareness campaigns** on ‘*Cleanliness and Hygiene*’ in the selected Panchayath. The awareness campaigns include: Swachhata seminars on ‘*MAKE INDIA CLEAN*’, Swachhata awareness lectures, Mouth –to – mouth talks among students and Kudumbasree – ADS (Area Development and Society) members, School level Competitions on ‘*SWACHH BHARAT*’, Online awareness through social media like Whatsapp groups, Distribution of pamphlets to students, households and General Public, etc.

One of the main attractions for conducting various Swachhata campaigns was in educational institutions that situated in the Vazhikkadavu village. EMOR Girls Higher Secondary School Palad, MOLP School Munda, MOUP School Munda, Guidance Public School, Munda, Edakkara Muslim Orphanage English

Medium School Munda etc. are some of the well know schools functioning in the village, of which two are affiliated to CBSE and the others are functioning under Kerala State Board. With the consent from the intern’s college nodal officer, head of the various institutions permitted him to conduct various Awareness Campaigns in their institutions. By using different methods of awareness campaigns, the intern conveyed about 650 students and 100 about the primary objectives of Swachh Bharat Mission and the importance of Swachhata in the Modern India.

As part of this internship, the intern got an opportunity to take an Orientation Class on ‘Swachh Bharath All India Campaign’ to the NSS Volunteers of EMOR Girls Higher Secondary School, Palad, one of the Kerala State Higher secondary School situated in Vazhikkadavu

He clarified the doubts and queries of the NSS Volunteers about ‘Swachh Bharat All India Campaign’ and explained various Swachhata activities that the Volunteers can do in their institution as part of their NSS activities. The intern distributed Pamphlets which contented about ‘Swachhata’ to all students with the help of the NSS Volunteers of EMOR Girls Higher Secondary School. In addition, with support of ICT, the intern organized a Power Point Presentation on ‘Make India Clean’. After the presentation the students of EMOR Girls Higher secondary School asked some doubts about the ‘Swachh Bharath All India Campaign’. The intern clarified all the doubts and queries of the students as well as the doubts of NSS coordinator about the Swachhata activities they can do in their institution and surroundings.

Another method that the intern used for conducting awareness programmes in Educational Institutions was organizing competitions. As part of the Swachhata Campaigns the intern conducted a Quiz Competition on ‘Swachh Bharat’ for the students of MOLP School Munda, Situated in Vazhikkadavu village in which 43 Lower primary students were participated. The competition covered the objectives of Swachh Bharat Mission, Words of Mahatma Gandhi on Swachhata, various Swachhata activities etc. The Head Master, Mr. Sunny Kurian distributed the prizes for the winners during their school assembly.

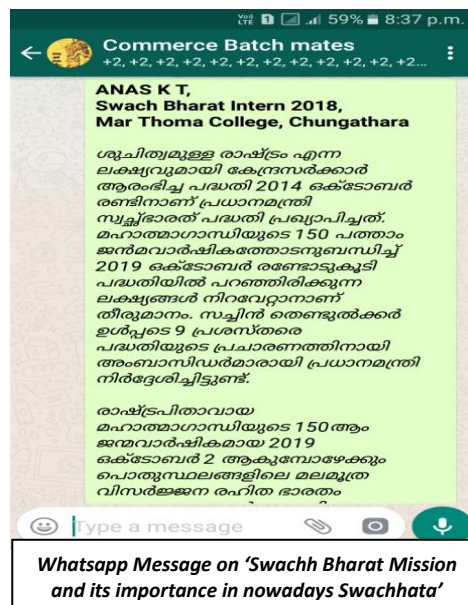

The intern conducted a Pencil Drawing Completion in Muslim Orphanage UP School Munda, another school, on ‘Clean India Healthy India’, for which the prizes were distributed by Mr. Thomas, Head Master during their School Assembly. About 30 students were participated in the pencil drawing

competition conducted in MOUP School Munda. The pictures drawn shown that the students have various ideas and vision about new clean and healthy India. Along with these completions, the intern made lectures on the topic ‘Clean India Clean Schools’ to both the students of MOLP School Munda and MOUP School Munda.

As we are living now in a Computer or Informatics era the intern used social media as a method of providing Swachhata Awareness through online. The youth today spent their evening most time with social media. And hence the used it as another method of awareness campaign for youth. Mainly he used ‘Whatsapp’, one of the prominent instant messaging social media, as a medium for providing awareness

among public through online. The main content of the Whatsapp message was about Swachh Bharath Mission and its objectives, activities one can do in their home and community, the problems of Open defecation etc.

Another attraction of the intern to spent his quality time and effort in fulfillment of Swachh Bharath Mission was on the members of various ‘Kudumbasree Units and Area Development Society’ functioning Vazhikkadavu

village. *Kudumbasree units* and *Area Development Society* are the Organizations of Self Help Groups (SHGs) of women in Kerala state is now considered as one of the largest women empowering project in India. They choose a family based approach; it reaches the family through women and the community through these families. And because of this reason the intern made a systematic approach to aware them about the importance of Swachhata in now days and was able to interact with them about taking precautions for various monsoon epidemic diseases due to unhealthy conditions, if any, existing in the village surroundings and back alleys.

As part of this internship he distributed about 1250 pamphlets among general public, school students and households. The pamphlet

distributed was a brief text contented about the various precautions that one should take in order to reduce the epidemic diseases spreading in rural areas due to unhygienic situations existing in surroundings.

2.2 DOOR – TO – DOOR VISITS

Door – to – Door visit is another important Swachhata activity for which the intern devoted most time of the internship period. During his internship course, he covered about 524 households which from both 12th and 18th ward of

Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath, and, it is a distinct experience for him when the intern interacts with the household people. The prime intention to visit the households was to check whether the local people resort to OPEN DEFECATION or not, and also to aware them about the serious problems that caused by open defecation. During the interaction with the people, it came to know that there was no open defecation among adults in the village but noticed open defecation among children aged 1 – 3 years old. The intern noticed that most of the households people were shy on disclosing the matter concerning about Open Defecation.

Nevertheless, he conveyed the households about the major problems caused by open defecation like scope of spreading of diseases like Cholera, Typhoid, diarrhea etc. in village areas. Along with the matter of Open defecation, the intern devoted some of his quality time to interact with them about other Swachhata activities that a community people can participate jointly and in distribution of pamphlets, which contented the

precautions to be taken for reducing or eliminating the monsoon epidemic diseases from the surroundings. Through casual talks and awareness building activities, he conveyed the message of Swachh Bharat mission and the relevance of keeping their home and surroundings clean. In addition he demonstrated some tips to avoid epidemics like unleashing the stripped water from water occupying materials, showing best area for digging compost pits by categorizing degradable and non-degradable substances etc. to make their home more eco friendly.

2.3 MOVIE/VIDEO SCREENINGS

As part the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship 2018, the intern shows many informative and awareness **Short films, Videos and Cartoons** as for both students and members of ‘Kudumbasree Units’, ‘Area Development Society’. These movies, videos and cartoon are all about

Swachhata activities, Waste management, recycling methods of Non – degradable substances, problems caused by open defecation etc. All these videos and short films in ‘YouTube’ displayed are in the mother language ‘*Malayalam*’

and so the attendees could easily understand what it conveys.

With the limited spaces the intern conducted screenings among the members of ‘THILAKKAM’, ‘VELICHAM’ and ‘SNEHAKKODU’, various ‘Kudumbasree Units’ functioning in 18th ward of Vazhikkadavu Local body. EMOR Girls Higher Secondary School, MOLP School Munda, MOUP

School Munda are the some of the institutions chosen for conducting Video screening. By interacting with the Students and Members of ‘Kudumbasree Unit’, the intern clarified the doubts and queries about the activities of Swachh Bharat Mission and Problems caused by open defecation. As part of this internship, he displayed seven screenings in the village and about 240 attendees were being part of it.

2.4 WASTE COLLECTION DRIVES, SEPERATION OF DEGRADABLE AND NON – DEGRADABLE WASTE & TRANSPORTATION OF WASTE FOR DISPOSAL

Another activity that the intern engaged as part of the summer internship was **Collection and Transportation of Bio Non – Degradable waste** from

households. With the support of village community people in the 1st Ward of Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath, he covered about 130 households for the collection of waste. Actually, this activity is going here for a past three years under the initiative of Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath.

Therefore, the intern was glad to be a part of this activity. He helped the village community people and the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Programme (MGNREGP) workers in collection of waste from households. The collected waste is sorted out with the help of community people into Bio degradable and Non – bio degradable waste. The explained the households about the need of separation of bio degradable and non-degradable from the households. The bio degradable waste can be used as manure in cultivation and on the other hand the Non – degradable waste is subjected to Recycling purpose and there by we could reduce the environmental loss and develop sustainability in the environment.

While collection of waste from households he could able to interact with the households and MGNREGP workers about the ‘Importance of Make India Clean campaign today and why from the grass roots, say villages’. With help of Mr. Sakeer, ‘Thannikkadavu’ Ward member of Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath, the collected Bio Non – Degradable waste were

transported to an appropriate open site and the same was subjected to further pick up for carrying it with the huge trucks of registered Bangalore Based Recycling Companies for its disposal. Recycling of household waste collected as part of the swatch Bharath initiative was a morally satisfying experience for the intern.

2.5 DEVELOPMENT OF COMPOST PITS

Development of Compost pit is another Swachhata activity that the intern included in his internship course with the immense support of village household people. The intern made the community households to aware about the Importance

digging compost pit at every individual’s home. While the Bio Non – degradable household waste are collected and then pick up for recycling purpose under the initiative of the local body, he suggested the community people for digging and developing compost pit in their own home for the disposal of the Bio – degradable household waste.

Later, the intern conveyed that, the disposed slurry of the degradable decayed waste could be used as best manure for cultivation at their own homes. As part of the internship he demonstrated and build four compost pits, of which one was man-made pit with the size of 4 x 3 x 2 ft (Length, Width, Depth). The other three were ready-made setting of compost pit with lengthy and large rounded PVC pipes given by the Vazhikkadavu Gram Panchayath; which the intern installed it with the help of community people.

2.6 SWACHHATA PLEDGING : OTHER ACTIVITY

Along with the Swachhata activities enlisted in the internship course, the intern included one more activity, ‘**SWACHHATA PLEDGING**’. The head of the various educational institutions were helped the intern to arrange massive Swachhata pledge ceremony in their institutions, especially during their school assembly. The NSS Volunteers of EMOR Girls Higher Secondary school were take oath in their school auditorium.

The students of MOLP School Munda, MOUP School Munda, CBSE Guidance Public School, Palad and CBSE Edakkara Muslim



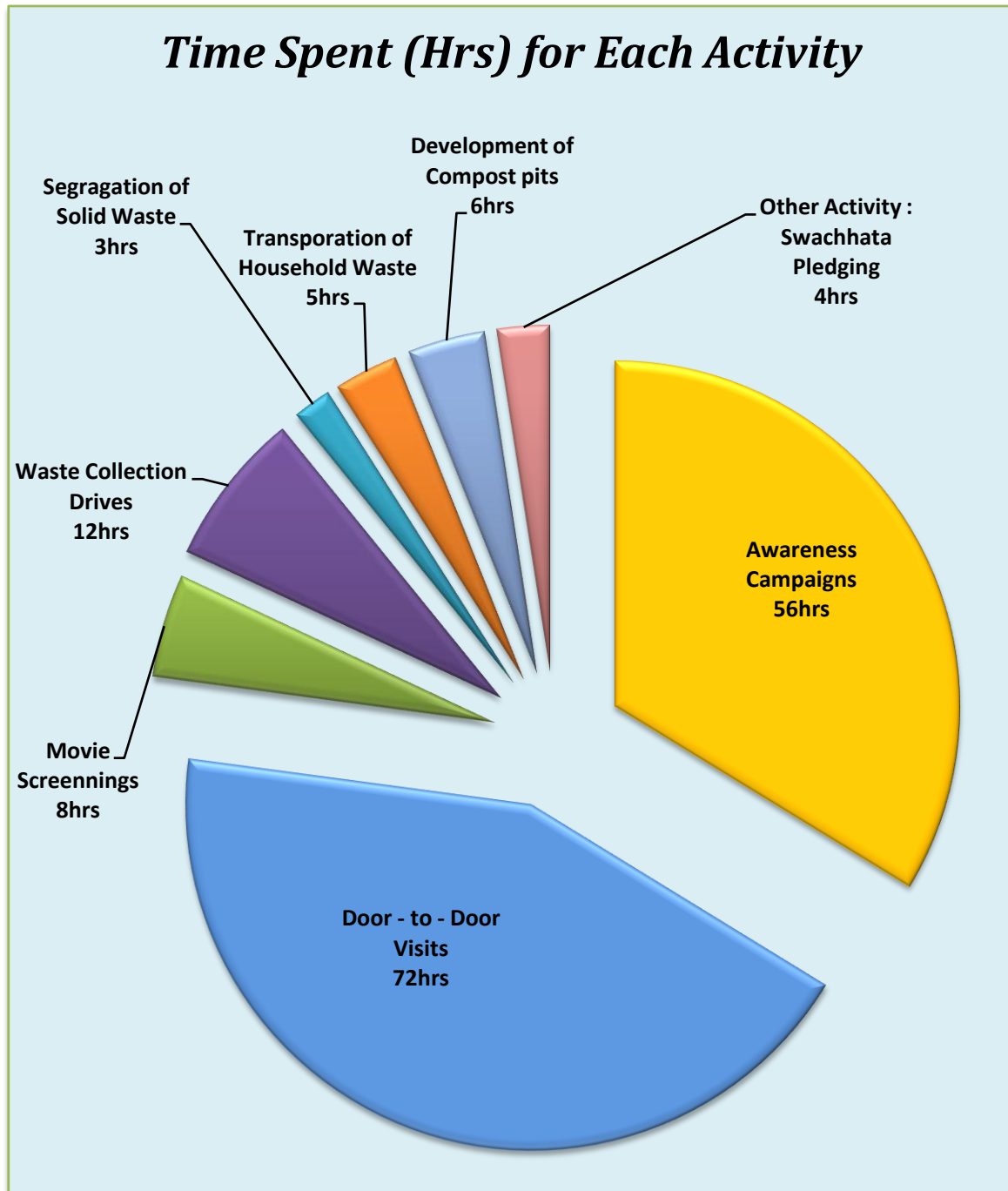

Vazhikkadavu were being a part of the Swachhata Pledge in their school assemblies. 2100 students and about 160 teachers took voluntary oath to maintain cleanliness of their surroundings on regular basis.

3. FINDINGS

- ✓ There is no open defecation in the Vazhikkadavu village but noticed in the households having children aged 1 – 3 years old
- ✓ Lack of proper waste disposal system in Vazhikkadavu village is a major problem existing here but the transportation of Bio Non – degradable waste in yearly shall solved the problem at a certain extent
- ✓ All village people have moderate information about Swachh Bharat All India Campaign
- ✓ Comparatively the personal hygiene of people lived in the remote area is poor than that of the people lived in town area
- ✓ No compost pit is dug in most of the households to dispose Bio – Degradable waste but are thrown out aimlessly
- ✓ The students are more aware about Health and personal hygiene than that of middle aged and elderly people in the village
- ✓ Viral fever is common in Vazhikkadavu village
- ✓ All households are keeping their toilets clean and secure from spreading diseases comes from open defecation
- ✓ There are no shared toilets for households. Everyone have their own toilet facilities
- ✓ All the school authority and students keep their institution toilets clean.
- ✓ The local body authority takes necessary steps to reduce the conditions of the waste dumping in back alleys.
- ✓ Because of lack of proper permanent plastic disposal system most households are subjected to burn the Plastic waste from their own home



4. CONCLUSION

Under "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan", the government has promised "total sanitation" by 2019, which means every household in India will have a toilet by the targeted deadline. As per UN reports Currently, nearly 60 percent of India's population practice open defecation which puts them at risk of diseases like cholera, diarrhea, typhoid etc. India also faces economic loss because of poor hygiene and sanitation in the country. India is a gold medalist in open defecation and nearly 60 per cent of Indian population clears their bowels in the open.

Poor hygiene and sanitation facilities costs India 600,000 lives annually because of diarrhea and not only this, lack of toilets also expose one third of country's women to the risk of rape or sexual assault. If India and its tourist destinations are clean, it will bring more people and will also bring about a paradigm shift in the country's global perception. If proper hygiene and sanitation will not become a practice in our country then no one will be able to save the country from the health hazards and losses that will loom over the Indian populace in near future. So, let's make Swachh Bharat a mass movement and save our country from all the dangers.
